ERASMUS Strategic Partnership LED ZINGONIA WORKSHOP 19-29 June 2016 Draft Agenda v.28.04.2016

FORWARD: GENERAL LOGISTICS

All students and professors will be guests of Palace Hotel in Zingonia for the entire workshop. We are currently sourcing working spaces among those that have been suggested by the municipality and those offered by various enterprises. All spaces and also canteens where we will eat, are within a three kilometer radius of the hotel. Students can therefore easily walk from one place to another and in this way better understand the local context and conditions.

Professors will be involved in three ways:

- 1 Impulse lectures (brief lecture on key themes of the workshop to connect the online course with the workshop)
- 2 supervising group work (working with students and providing research and representation methods/assistance)
- 3- monitoring the progress of the workshop (daily micro-meetings among professors and tutors)

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The workshop will take place in Zingonia, Italy June 19-29, 2016. The goal of the workshop is to give students the opportunity to engage in a participatory process in the context of an existing Participant Action Research project called Orizzonte Zingonia.

This workshop also aims to give students the opportunity to encounter a real and human landscape, with the possibility to meet the principal partners/stakeholders involved in the processes currently taking place in Zingonia. These are,

- citizens (groups of citizens divided into different groups with respect to where they live in Zingonia)
- Institutions (such as the 5 mayors of Zingonia, the city does not have just one)
- Social communities / associations (Singhalese association, migrants units, Garden Association)
- Local school community (teachers students families)
- Local Oratory community
- Entrepreneurs

We are identifying possible partners/stakeholders both through the actual board of the Project "Orizzonte Zingonia", and through a first-hand investigation of the area.

Our goal is to identify a few persons for each group (2 or 3 but no more) which could be considered special ambassadors for the group and to the workshop itself.

We are asking these ambassadors to be available for a few days in order to meet our groups, walk with them and answer questions. (We are coordinating a schedule that will suit their availability during the days of the workshop).

An important objective of this workshop is that our involvement be useful and can add to the initiatives already in place by "Orizzonte Zingonia Project".

On MAY the 14th we will have the opportunity to meet these ambassadors and will provide them a CAMERA through which we will ask them to "lend us their eyes" and report back to us with images of "their landscape."

(We will provide them with a series of questions). A key element to be aware of that these ambassadors can be divided into two different groups: a) those capable of speaking in front of large groups (such as mayors, entrepreneurs, etc); b) others who can share personal witness accounts, whom we will interview elsewhere, such as during a walk together or asking them to tell us their own experience as it would be a tale (story telling). The calendar of the workshop will take into account the diversification among the partners/stakeholders.

THEMES: GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

The goal is to provide students with the opportunity to collaborate among each other and within the community to develop a strategic vision for addressing one or more of the following areas of focus, defined for you in collaboration with community partners

- a) living: housing and community
- b) livability and the public realm
- c) ecology and productive landscapes
- d) the social and economic agents
- e) education, culture and communication

LANDSCAPE'S LAYERS

The particular location of the Workshop will stimulate students to reflect upon the various layers that make up all landscapes and in particular those at play in Zingonia:

- Landscape historical layer
- Social layer
- Institutional/Administrative Landscape
- Aesthetical Layer
- Virtual Landscape
- Economical layer

In relation to the above mentioned layers, please refer to the LED General Project document.

We will have an impulse lecture for each of the above mentioned layers in order to provide students with case studies and/or research methodologies and/or examples of how these are found in Zingonia.

POTENTIAL RESEARCH SITES: PLACES

Research sites should correspond with the overall goals and objectives of the workshop:

- Condomimums/tower apartments: housing & community
 - E.g. block housing, population density, social-economic demographics/building
- Public spaces : livability & the public realm
 - E.g. typical places of gathering; piazzas, courtyards, parking areas
- Urban gardens: ecology & productive landscapes
 - E.g. gardens, garden associations
- Production spaces: social & economic agents
 - E.g. warehouses, factories empty or in partial use
- Informal public spaces: education, culture & communication
 - E.g. spaces between buildings, curbs, steps, outside shops

WORKSHOP PHASES

ANALYSING

Students will be divided into five groups that correspond to the above mentioned layers, each group is to act as a specialist research team for their assigned layer. To ensure consistent results among different groups, layer research findings will be presented with a SWOT analysis. Supervising professors for assigned to a layer, are invited to share tools and methods that they see fit in order to assist students with the final SWOT analysis and presentation.

2. VISIONING

At this phase, following presentations of SWOT analysis by layers, students will be organized into new groups based on their research site of interest (themes). Professor will suggest methods of research to arrive at innovative representations, developing a gameboard, of their chosen site category. The results of this phase will be presented in an open public format.

3. TRANSFORMING

This final phase is about design through transformative design processes that could empower stakeholders, partners and locals to remain active in their community, bringing forward manageable initiatives/tasks/activities that might ameliorate their spaces. Note, at the middle of the workshop a group of Italian scouts will be present, ready and willing to move projects forward during the weekend. This means, that they can provide manual labor to begin suggested student proposals.

RESEARCH APPROACH

1. GROUNDING

- short impulse lectures introducing some of the theories of landscape democratic design and planning work
- group discussions
- input from tutors during the GROUP WORK AND SUPERVISION sessions

2. FIELD WORK

During the first three days students will form groups to develop an in-depth investigation of one of the above mentioned themes

3. REPORTING

Students will be asked to report of their work to all other members of the workshop community and, on midterm and finals day, to the larger community

4. GROUP WORK AND SUPERVISION

- Students will come together in a collaborative group setting to synthesize their data collection into a strategic landscape proposal.
- Tutors will guide students, ensuring sure that their work is professional, rigorous, and grounded in democratic thinking/practices
- 5. CITIZENS HELP DESK (during weekdays, at the Orizzonte Zingonia Project office, students will be available for specific questions/concerns regarding place categories)

OUTPUTS AND PROFESSIONAL CONTRIBUTION

Each team is responsible for a sub-section of the proposal, documenting:

a) the process/DOCUMENTATION OF THEIR WORK

- The proposal will be structured according to a common graphic template to be defined at the beginning of the workshop
- b) the analysis/ RIGOROUS INVESTIGATION
 - outreach/EVIDENCE OF ENGAGEMENT
 - Participation in team work and demonstrated leadership in the process
- c) synthesis: SWOT ANALYSIS
- d) visioning: A strategic landscape intervention/GAME BOARD
- e) communication: A GRAPHICALLY REPRESENTATED VISION and PHASING/IMPLEMENTATION/ GOVERNANCE MODELS

RULES OF ENGAGEMENT

Participating in this workshop includes full knowledge and acceptance of the following:

- It is key that we are mindful of the residents and locals of Zingonia. This means when we are speaking them and taking photographs. Ask first, do not assume you can photograph a shop or person.
- All students will work in a group setting and must be prepared to share, collaborate, participate and present with their student group members as well as with participating professors.
- In all settings; work spaces, hotel, canteens, outside in Zingonia, remember that you are representing your local university and this overall European project, therefore have respect for those around you and for the spaces you will see.

EVALUATION RUBRIC

Following presentations, students will receive verbal feedback and evaluation from professors based on the categories below:

A. Clearly developed conceptual approach/thesis, showing clear evolution. Excellent graphics, chosen among those that best show the key qualities of the project. Logical, organized, well thought out and delivered presentation, showing a deep knowledge of problems and nuances. Smooth and logical transitions between portions of the narrative. Free of typos, errors. Presentation shows editing and rehearsing.

B. Clearly developed conceptual/thesis approach showing knowledge and good understanding of the key issues. Evolution of thinking is present, but not completely clear. Good graphics, with only minor flaws (lack of scale etc). Most illustrations are useful in supporting concept. A relatively smooth presentation with only a few gaps. Drawings depict basic structure of the project, but lack detail. Few errors/omissions/typos, but a clearly rehearsed and developed text.

C. Concept is present, but is incomplete and needs further development or shows limited development (a solution developed early and never tested). Sufficient support material. Analysis is spotty and at times contradictory. Presentation shows many gaps and inconsistencies. Drawings/illustrations of projects are limited, incomplete or inconsistent with the concept/thesis. Few typos, despite signs of some care and editing of text.

D. The concept is missing or unclear despite efforts. Analysis is limited, spotty, or oversimplified. Presentation shows many problems, gaps, incomplete or confused narrative. Drawings are of poor quality, generic, or showing

information irrelevant to the project. Typos and other mechanical errors are present but there is evidence of some editing.

F. Concept shows a misunderstanding of issues and problems. Analysis findings, even when present, are inconsequential to the design. Presentation shows lack of a narrative and is fragmented and confused. Drawings are inconsequential, uninspiring or effortless. Numerous typos, errors, no scale/north arrows or other drawings conventions show no effort in editing or last minute production.

Students will evaluate the outputs of the workshop: the themes presented, overarching themes and research approach to better understand these and use them as design tools, their overall impressions of the workshop and its organization by means of a module provided at the closing.

FIRST PHASE:

ANALYSING

In this phase, students are divided in groups by LANDSCAPE'S LAYERS in order to create 'specialists' for each theme. Each group can evolve various analysis methods as suggested for their specific theme and/ or by their tutor. The results of the independent and methodologically diverse analyses will be synthesized in a SWOT analysis, a problem-solving and project-planning tool that can bring key issues of relevance forward. Factors to be taken into account are:

- STRENGTH, considered an internal factor (e.g. which resources are available to you?)
- WEAKNESSES, considered an internal factor (e.g. What would work against you?)
- OPPORTUNITIES, considered an external factor
- THREATS, considered an external factor

The final presentation of the SWOT ANALYSIS will be digital. Tutors and professors will communicate (TBA) the maximum number and focus of the slides in order to have consistent presentations.
